5.3.1 Tracking Women's Application, Acceptance, and Enrollment Rates at SPIHER

SPIHER aims to increase the number of female students entering higher education by offering financial support and conducting awareness programs in schools. Many girl students hesitate to join college due to financial challenges, lack of awareness, or social barriers. To support them, SPIHER provides scholarships and fee concessions and reaches out to schools to motivate students and parents. This document explains how these efforts help improve female admissions

1. Data Collection and Analysis

To effectively monitor women's application and acceptance rates, SPIHER would need a robust framework for collecting, analysing, and reporting gender-based data. Key indicators might include:

SPIHER systematically monitors gender representation across all stages of the admissions process to ensure equity and inclusion. This involves analysing applications by gender, capturing the total number of applications received and categorizing them as male, female, or non-binary, with additional program-specific data across disciplines such as STEM, humanities, and business. The institution also evaluates acceptance rates by gender to identify any disparities in admission decisions and ensure fairness in selection processes. Furthermore, enrollment or entry rates by gender are closely tracked to measure the proportion of accepted applicants who proceed to enrol, offering insights into both acceptance outcomes and conversion to registration. Finally, SPIHER regularly reviews retention and progression rates, monitoring students' academic journeys through to graduation, with data disaggregated by gender to detect whether women face unique barriers affecting persistence or completion.

Systematic Tracking of Women's Application and Admission Rates at SPIHER

St. Peter's Institute of Higher Education and Research (SPIHER) places strong emphasis on gender equity and inclusive access in all academic programmes. As part of this commitment, the University systematically records, reviews, and analyses the application and admission trends of women students every academic year. This continuous monitoring has allowed the institution to better understand gender-related patterns in admissions and to implement strategic initiatives that encourage female participation in higher education.

A comparative analysis of the admission data from 2021 to 2024 clearly demonstrates a steady and positive increase in the number of girls applying to and enrolling in various programmes at SPIHER. In 2021, the number of female applicants and admitted students was moderate, reflecting the impact of pandemic-related challenges and limited outreach possibilities. However, with the introduction of more student-centric initiatives, enhanced counselling support, awareness programmes, and digital admission facilitation tools, the University witnessed a visible rise in female applications in 2022.

This upward trend continued in 2023, when targeted awareness campaigns, school-level interactions, and programme-specific orientations helped attract more girls to science, humanities, commerce, and professional courses. The institution's focus on a safe campus environment, supportive faculty mentorship, and career-oriented programmes also played an important role in boosting enrolments. By 2024, the admission statistics reflected the strongest increase in female enrolment compared to the previous three years. The rise highlights growing trust in SPIHER's academic quality, campus safety measures, and the supportive ecosystem created for women learners.

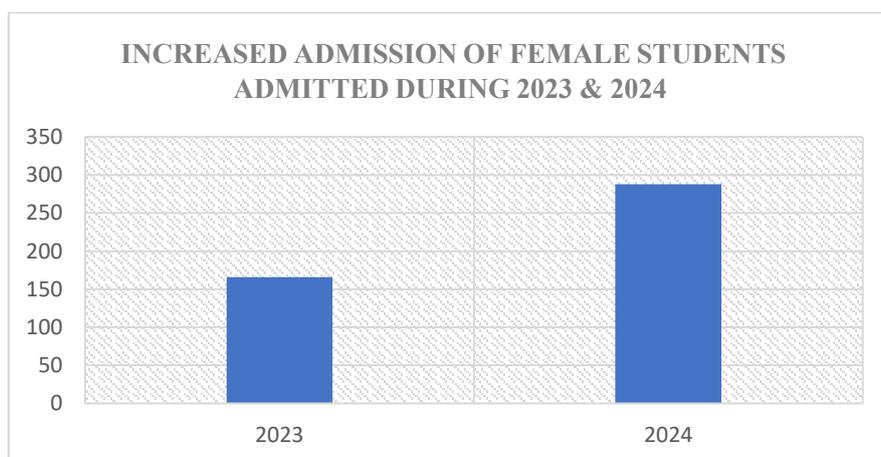
Through systematic data tracking and continuous improvement, SPIHER ensures transparency in admissions while promoting gender-balanced participation. The significant increase in girls' admissions over the years reaffirms the institution's commitment to empowering women through equitable higher education opportunities and sustained academic support.

The admission trend for girl students at SPIHER over the four-year period from 2021 to 2024 shows a steady and healthy. In 2021, the number of girls admitted was 150, which reflects the early stage of focused gender-inclusion initiatives at the institution. With expanded awareness programmes, targeted counselling, and improved admission facilitation, the number increased to 170 in 2022, showing the impact of enhanced outreach efforts.

In 2023, the admissions rose further to 195, marking the strengthening confidence of female applicants in SPIHER's academic environment, safety measures, and student-support mechanisms. By 2024, the girl student admissions reached 288, representing the highest count in the four-year period. This reflects SPIHER's continuous improvement in communication, community engagement, and female-friendly campus policies.

Analysis and Observations

- Female students constitute a significant proportion of the total enrollment, particularly in disciplines such as **Life Sciences, Commerce, and Humanities**.
- Active efforts have been made to improve women's participation in **STEM programs (Engineering, Computer Science, and Mathematics)** through targeted outreach, scholarships, and career counselling.
- The steady increase in female enrollment at the **doctoral level** reflects SPIHER's supportive research environment and focus on promoting women in academia and innovation.
- The gender ratio across programs indicates equitable access, consistent with the university's non-discrimination policy and UGC's Gender Sensitization guidelines.

A year-on-year review reveals a **progressive rise in women’s enrollment** across all levels, highlighting the effectiveness of institutional strategies such as:

- Mentoring and role-model programs led by women faculty and alumni.
